PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow ASHA Members:

I hope you are enjoying the season and your horses in the fashion you enjoy most. Up here in the almost frozen north, the weather has moderated and cooled into the 60s and those of us who are who are acclimatized are greatly enjoying the change. However, winter is just around the corner, so we have to make sure that the hay is in the barn and the fodder is in the shock at this time of the year.

Your Association finally completed paying off our obligations in the Wareing lawsuit this summer. August 1 we transmitted the final \$5,500 to Wareings and recently settled our \$15,000 attorney bill for \$7,500. I know this has been a long and unfortunate road that we have had to travel. I give credit however to our membership, which stood together and personally dipped into their own personal finances to bear the enormous cost of the lawsuit and ultimately save the registry from becoming financially overwhelmed. There are many many lessons to be learned by all involved and I know you would hope that this sort of experience is never repeated.

Hopefully, the lesson that can be taken from all of this is that we cannot allow personal animus to draw our organization into disputes. We are all very passionate about our horses and the issues surrounding the organization, but we need to remember to temper that passion with perspective and wisdom. There are no winners which resulted from this litigation and in fact we are all substantially poorer as a result. Hopefully, the next time a dispute arises between members, the Association and its membership will not be victimized.

If, when disputes arise, we attempt to work with those who disagree with us to achieve a compromise result, we will find the resulting decision is ultimately much wiser and also much more likely to be acceptable to all the parties concerned. This lesson is applicable not only to our organization but frankly to Washington and our local state capitols as well. Remember, that those that disagree with us are usually motivated by the same passions and prejudices that we have but perhaps view the issues through the prism of their own experience and goals. That doesn't make us right and them wrong. The reaching of a compromise is not a sell out. It is actually the wisest form of governance.

We have an important election coming up. I am pleased that we have had such a strong interest in board service. Please take the time to carefully review the board candidates' information and make the choices that you believe will best serve the organization. As always, if you have questions, comments or concerns, myself or my fellow board members are more than happy to try and help.

I am semi-retired and have the time and commitment to attend board meetings and participate in committees. I have sufficient financial resources for travel expenses.

This past year I agreed to fill a term on the ASHA Board that had been vacated. I have found the board to be a hard working group and have enjoyed the experience. During this term I have served as the treasure of ASHA.

Together with my wife, we have raised Shires for more than fifteen years at our farm called Sudden Creek Shires. We started with two grade fillies. Since that time we have developed and maintained a herd of approximately 35 registered horses. Currently our herd is comprised of fourteen senior mares, ten junior fillies, one stud and ten geldings. In 2010, we had seven foals; in 2011, we expect to have twelve.

In addition to breeding, we have shown our horses in both the regional and national Shire shows. (When possible we also participate in local fairs and expositions.) We have exhibited in both halter and hitch classes. Our largest hitch is four-horse.

In 2006, we were proud when our junior mare received National Reserve Grand Champion at the national show in Columbus. Additionally, our unicorn hitch placed first at the same show.

We work continuously to improve both the quality and quantity of our breeding stock. In the past three years, we have retained our best fillies in addition to making strategic purchases to elevate the quality our stock.

I feel that the ASHA must continue to encourage members to improve quality of the breed. This can be accomplished through show presence / sponsorship and breeder education.

I have used all of the services provided by the ASHA. As a result, I am aware and familiar with these services. Generally speaking, I find them reasonable and helpful. Specifically, I have attended a national board meeting and I have exhibited in both regional and national shows.

My contributions to the board will be enhanced by having first-hand experience with ASHA services. Combined with my 40+ years of business management and board of directors' experience, I am confident that I can bring ideas and procedures that may be of benefit to the ASHA Board.

An issue that I feel is important is the governance guidelines for the board of directors. For many years we have shown both halter and hitch at most Regional Shire shows in the East and many local fairs. We have been fortunate in having several national champions over the years. We hope to continue raising Shires which represent the best of the breed. My goals include the continued accurate registration of Shires as well as promoting this wonderful breed thru showing, farm tours & trade fairs.

I utilize all of the services that the Association offers. We register and transfer, show at Regional and National Shows, & utilize the website for a variety of purposes. Most importantly we enjoy the close connection with other members at various events and thru direct communication. My strengths are my historic knowledge, ability to work with others & a desire to improve the ASHA & recognition of the Shire in America.

I have been a strong advocate of involving and fully disclosing Association business to the membership. I am in favor of cooperation between the various Shire breed associations, but I do not favor dual registration. Shires should only be registered in the country of residence and should be eligible for reciprocal registration should they be exported to another country. This is the way all other breed registries operate and I will continue to work with the Shire Horse Society to bring about a mutual agreement similar to that which we enjoy with the Canadian Shire Horse Association.

The ASHA needs a greater funding base. Members continue to look upon the Association to promote Shires and provide member services, but without adequate funds the efforts often fall short. I would propose a major effort to increase funding without raising registration fees.

I believe that the American Shire Horse Association is a strong, healthy association which does a good job of insuring accurate registration of Shire Horses and serving the needs of its members. Improvements are always possible and I would work diligently to bring them about. I would appreciate your vote.

I plan to attend all ASHA meetings, and will work on committees.

Currently own / co-own 17 Shires, breeding 3 – 5 mares per year. ASHA life member since 1979; board member 1987 – 1993 and 2003 – 2006; ASHA president 1989 – 1993; ASHA secretary 1996 – 2002, assistant secretary 2002 – 2003.

Exhibitor since 1978, including ASHA national shows at Sacramento (2x), Eugene (2x), LA County Fair (4x), Pueblo (5x), Rifle, Harrisburg (2x), Oklahoma, and Blackfoot, including hitches at 4 of those sites; attended national shows at Iowa and Indianapolis to help friends show; numerous regional shows, including LA (20x) and Rifle (5x) and open shows including National Western Stock Show (Denver), Sandpoint and Boise (ID), and the following California shows: Hayward Rowell Ranch, Grass Valley, Ventura Co. Fair, Yolo Co. Fair, Yuba Co. Fair, and Lake Co. Fair.

Exhibited numerous national and regional show grand, reserve grand and junior champions.

As breeder, cooperated w/ UC Davis in early equine reproductive technology work, resulting in first draft horse foal from frozen semen (1989), first draft horse foal from frozen embryo (1991), and early draft horse foals from embryo transfer (1987).

Served as secretary / organizer of ASHA 100th anniversary national show in Blackfoot (1985).

Compiled first modern update of ASHA registration rules in 1988 and led board in adopting blood-typing and parentage verification as warranty of pedigree, and later conversion to DNA.

Organized education days for several ASHA annual meetings, obtaining speakers such as Josh Lyons, Steve Bowers, veterinarian for US Olympic team, tour at UC Davis, etc.

Paid for nationally-known organizational consultants to speak at 1995 and 2002 meetings.

Worked with LA Fair to develop ASHA regional / national show there.

Introduced first accounting software for ASHA (1987) and obtained registry software (1996).

Modest – may not show 6-horse hitch, will continue breeding quality horses and exhibiting as possible.

Reasonable membership growth; encourage past members to re-join.

Fiscal responsibility, including adoption of a balanced budget and review of current fee structure.

Return to affordable, informative newsletter -- members can advertise to targeted audience, receive education and information.

Encourage member-based promotions such as Equine Affaire.

Research causes of drop in memberships and registrations and resultant financial constraints.

Register / transfer horses, exhibit at ASHA-sponsored shows, read bulletin.

I have raised most of funds and served as (unpaid) show manager for ASHA regional / national shows at Rifle since 2004 (show committee must raise ALL funds for operation of the show and premiums, unlike any other ASHA show)

Strong historical knowledge of ASHA development, as an active participant during the last 32 years; understanding of non-profit law and IRS requirements; many years experience on both for-profit and non-profit boards, and an understanding of the fiduciary responsibilities of board members; willingness to travel at my own expense in order to help promote ASHA at events (evidenced by past travel to Equine Affaire, Equitana, Stock Show, Sandpoint & Small Farmers Journal Auction booths) and to become a better educated board member (20 years attendance at National Pedigreed Livestock Council and several draft horse presidents' & secretaries' meetings [all but 2 NPLC and 1 pres/secy meetings at my own expense]); understanding of financial statements and registry policies; understanding of the importance of every member to ASHA; ability to focus on benefits to ASHA over and above impacts on personal situation.

ASHA's current financial situation is precarious, resulting from precipitous declines in membership as well as registry activity, which have followed (but did not entirely result from) the expenses associated with the Wareing lawsuit. ASHA registered only 19 horses during the first 6 months of 2010 and showed a loss of over \$5,000 during what has historically been a profitable period of the year. Membership is lower than it has been since the late 1980s. It is crucial to balance the budget as well as attempt to reverse the membership and breeding-activity losses of the last few years. ASHA may need to rely on volunteers to perform some of the activities which in more-prosperous years the association was able to underwrite. Unless these declines are reversed, I am not sure the association will survive.

The animosity resulting from the lawsuit must be put in the past, including reaching out to (past) members who became inactive or refused to rejoin as a result.

ASHA must once-again operate in a business-like manner while simultaneously encouraging volunteer activity. I believe the board must focus on ASHA's core processes and clearly define its expectations in these areas, with quantifiable goals. Increasing the number of locations where we promote Shires with a merchandise booth is one possibility. I managed the ASHA inventory as "Merchandise chairman" from 1985 to 2003. Sales went from a few caps and t-shirts at the Blackfoot show to over \$10,000 in 2003. I am willing to travel at my own expense to operate merchandise booths where we can. Members must be made to feel welcome and appreciated for any projects they undertake on ASHA's behalf.

I am not entirely sure what is meant by "personal goals for the Board," but I believe that a nation-wide organization must make extraordinary efforts to communicate with its members and to understand its

customer-service oriented mission. *Nothing* is more important in order for ASHA to survive.

Fulfilling a director's position would not be much more than I already do for ASHA. Meeting attendance should be no problem for my schedule.

I currently own 17 registered shire horses. My current operation involves breeding, exhibitions, showing, farming, riding, and instruction. I feel I have made some good accomplishments to promote the shire breed including, showing from one horse in halter to having up to 11 in a full show string. Also showing from cart to an eight horse hitch, at local, regional and national levels. I have been in numerous parades. I have used my shires for work in the Cuyahoga National Forest, to help with forest maintenance. I have operated a mixed power source farm.

The future goals I have set for myself and my horses includes, continuing to breed a quality animal that will stand the test of time, and fulfill the job that the shire was bred and designed originally to do. This in mind, I believe the shire to be a versatile animal that is able to perform in any field it is presented. Another goal for my breeding program is to establish a 6 to 8 horse hitch, all of homebred and raised horses.

Looking ahead for the future of the shire breed and ASHA, I have a few goals in mind. Education needs to be social, fun and inviting to ASHA members and non-members. With outreach to non-members, non-shire owners, and non-horse owners, this approach may encourage new involvement or membership.

Establish a stallion AND mare evaluation (not inspection) on an educational base. This is not to restrict or limit any horse from breeding or use, but instead to encourage improvement through education.

Seek out greater shire involvement and opportunities in the southeast states region. There are many shires in that region, but few shows or activities in that area to support them.

If I were elected to the board, I would be bringing over 35 years of equine industry knowledge, personal and professional, to the table. I have been a member of local and regional draft horse organizations, as well as holding offices. I am currently involved with the Ohio Regional Clydesdale & Shire Association, as the Shire Trustee. I spent nearly 20 years operating, with the help of family, a commercial owned hitch. Along with all of this, I have been a farrier for over 35 years.

As a life member of ASHA, I utilize the benefits that come with being a member including, lower registry and transfer rates. I use the Shire Studbook to not only look up pedigrees, but to also find horses to participate in different

events. I am currently on the Trade Show Committee as head coordinator for the Ohio Equine Affaire. I am also the Breed Show Coordinator for the Ohio State Fair Shire Regional Show. For the past 3 years I have been the Shire representative at Horse Progress Days. There are other local horse shows and expos that I attend regularly. I do all these things because not only do I love playing with my horses, but I believe in the breed.

There are 3 issues I see to be very important; which are listed in no particular order. Upholding the Studbook - Parent verification, working with other associations from around the world. Breed Promotion - Expos, shows, educational clinics, targeting specific market groups. Finances - Strengthen financial standing of ASHA

I would like to see the ASHA board accomplish a more aggressive educational program on every level of activity. With the limited membership, I would like to see more outside contacts for information on showing, field events, and riding, etc. This would enable us to help guide, as well as allow creativity for the shire owner to enjoy and utilize this great breed. I also believe the board needs to review and amend, if needed, the association's constitution to bring it up to date, based on current or past issues.

Being "retired" gives me the time to choose how to spend it. I am committed to the work of ASHA. I've been involved with ASHA since 1998, when I bought my first two horses. Since then I bought two mares, one of which I bred A.I. The thing I'm most personally satisfied with is the fact that I've essentially raised and trained my horses alone, with no outside help. In a quirky way, it connects me with my agrarian heritage.

My involvement with Shires primarily reflects a personal interest in a beautiful draft animal in need of preservation.

I do not show, though, I recognize that exhibition is important to the future of the breed and, to the breeder. I participate in local parades and host visits to my small, 35-acre farm, on which I produce pasture and hay. Bud and Duke accompanied a camo-clad homecoming queen candidate last year, while the others rode in convertible autos.

The main ASHA services I've utilized are registration and transfer of ownership. In a nutshell, the things that are important for ASHA to address are finance, marketing, membership and improving the breed over-all.

I've served on a variety of associations, boards and commissions during my career spanning 30 years as university extension educator, and following. I'm aware that some degree of conflict is inevitable in most organizations. Working to achieve consensus is important.

Democracy is not efficient, but an 7y organization should strive to move forward in keeping with its mission. That usually requires compromise and flexibility among members and leadership.

I've attended two national ASHA meetings and have service on past Education and Nomination Committees. In terms of goals, on-going efforts to meet financial challenges are important. The association must operate within revenue constraints which focus upon generally accepted organizational priorities.

Further, expanding membership is important, as well as seeking ways to attract former members. ASHA must strive to be seen by members as worthy of investment in order to thrive.

Additionally, education initiatives are important, though sometimes difficult to achieve in a decentralized organization such as ASHA.

Marketing the Shire is achieved in part by its presence at major exhibitions, which should be maintained and expanded as resources allow.

Finally, and of primary importance, we must continue to seek ways to improve the breed while maintaining breed standards. While there is resistance to programs that attempt to evaluate breeding animals, I feel that we should look at programs that do that in a fair and cost effective manner. As a Board member I would be eager to hear ideas from membership to accomplish this.

I will commit the necessary time and financial resources to attend meetings and carry out committee work if re-elected to the ASHA Board.

My involvement with ASHA started in the mid-1980's. I am a life member and currently own three Shire horses, all home raised and registered with ASHA. While I bred and showed Shires in the past, I presently have the horses for pleasure. My main accomplishments with Shires are the showing of my mare Whitefeather Lady Di to National Championships in the U.S. and Canada, winning numerous other breed championships and performance awards with this mare and raising good quality Shire foals from her line. At the moment, my future goals for my Shires are to keep them healthy and content and to enjoy their 'company'.

My goals for ASHA include identifying innovative, affordable ways to overcome some of the standard problems that occur in organizations relying heavily on volunteer help so more time and resources can be applied to improving and promoting the breed, and more effectively serving the membership. Volunteers are one of the greatest assets an organization can have, but running the day-to-day business aspects of that organization on

volunteer help is problematic. The primary job of the board of directors should be to preserve and direct the organization into the future. Other tasks include oversight of day-to-day aspects, and dealing with special situations that arise. In order to do this, adequate levels of administrative resources are needed to handle the business aspects. Without enough of these resources, a large majority of the board's available time is taken up handling administrative tasks, which leaves less time to address longer range issues. Increasing administrative resources also has the benefit of providing more 'depth' to the organization in the event of an emergency with the secretary or a board member. I would also like to see ASHA further expand educational resources to members and the public and identify ways to better promote the breed and support our breeders.

My past ASHA involvement includes registering and transferring horses, showing and three previous appointments to the board to complete terms for resigning board members. I was elected to the board in 2006 and currently serve as vice president. I have been involved in updating by laws and registration rules. Committee activities include breed shows, education, finance, bulletin, rules/editing and trade shows/merchandise. Working with Clark Jenson, we wrote and produced an educational video on Shire conformation. I organize ASHA booths for equine trade shows and Horse Progress Days and have been coordinator for the Shire Show in Harrisburg, PA for several years, first helping Doug Ertel, who established the show, and taking over when Doug resigned due to job demands. I have worked to improve board – member communications through the website and newsletter by posting board meeting announcements, agendas and minutes, soliciting member input and expanding information in the member bulletin. I attend meetings of the Draft Horse Registries and National Pedigreed Livestock Council to keep ASHA current with the practices, accomplishments and problems of other registries.

My major strengths for this position are time, experience and willingness to work for ASHA and its members. Other strengths are skills in organization, listening and writing, a reasonably open mind and a strong desire to strengthen this organization to better promote Shires and serve the membership.

The following are areas I consider most important to ASHA and the Board of Directors and how they might be addressed:

Protect and strengthen ASHA during the current economic down turn by preserving assets and identify options for decreasing expenses and increasing revenue. Identify opportunities to support breeders and encourage membership renewals and new memberships.

Continue the struggle in the ever difficult area of improving communication with members through better use of electronic and written media. In the area of electronic communication, this may require revisions to the existing by laws.

Investigate the possibilities of using business service companies to 'subcontract' general administrative tasks.

This could aid ASHA by providing greater depth of resources for routine tasks, possibly allow some expansion of services to members and lessen the burden on the secretary and board, giving them more time for other endeavors to better promote the breed and serve the members.

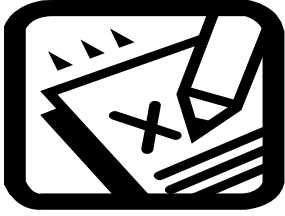
