

Secretary's Report – Myrna Rhinehart

<u>From the Book of Numbers so far in 2013:</u> Registrations – 106 (54 mares, 36 stallions, 15 geldings, 1 SSHR) Transfers – 140 (91 mares, 22 stallions, 25 geldings, 2 SSHR) Pending Registrations –12 waiting for hair samples Current Membership – 351 (121 Life Members)

I've heard a few times that a few people are concerned about the condition of the association. So I'd thought I'd put a graphic to the numbers. These are statistics from the last three years, with a caveat that we have completed only three quarters of 2013. We still have three months to go in 2013.

If all the hair samples for the pending registrations are sent in this year, we will have exceeded the registrations for 2012, and that is only for what we have in the files right now. I'm impressed by the number of gelding registrations and transfers this quarter! In other breeds, geldings have much more "value" than in drafts, but these numbers seem to indicate that the geldings are holding their own value in the market! People value those "birth certificates" for their horses, even if they can't breed them.

Transfers are usually dictated by the horse sales market, but if you have "outdated" transfers, send them in today to get your horses up-to-date! Membership is up some admittedly since the board reinstated members after the assessment, but we are still gaining new members. We have 1500 "Likes" on our Facebook page, but we have to figure out how to convert those "Likes" to memberships. Membership renewals will be sent out soon, if you haven't already received yours by this date.



WINTER HORSE CARE TIPS FOR OWNERS

Horses can live outside in comfort year round with a few amenities provided by their owners. Winter horse care requires feed modifications, attention to detail, mud and ice management, and shelter from the elements.

Feed Modifications

The average horse needs to consume 2% of his body weight per day to maintain body condition. The bulk of the horse's diet should consist of forage (either hay or pasture). It is generally understood that some horses require less than 2% of their body weight per day in feed

especially if they are easy keepers while others (pregnant mares, working athletes, breeding stallions, older horses, etc.) could require up to 3% of their body weight in feed per day. A normal 1,000 pound horse that receives the bulk of his feed in hay should usually consume roughly 20 pounds of hay per day. In especially cold weather that same horse might need 25 or 30 pounds of hay per day to stay warm. Your horse should be fed in accordance with his body type; level of exercise; and with the input of a veterinarian, nutritionist, or feed specialist.

Fiber digestion is what keeps your horse warm. During especially cold times it is important that your horse is fed adequate forage (hay or grass) to produce body heat from digestion. When bad weather comes you might need to feed your horse additional hay meals throughout the day to ensure he is eating enough fiber to stay warm.

The best way to manage that easy keeper is to purchase low nutrient grass hay (one that is mature, but dry and free of dust and mold) which will provide forage for his consumption but not add excess calories. Likewise an older horse or hard keeper is best managed on immature, tender, nutrient rich hay. These horses could reap the most benefit from alfalfa hay (or an alfalfa grass mix) as it is higher in calories than grass hay.

Water and Salt

Increased hay consumption can easily cause impaction if your horse isn't drinking enough. Check the horse's water source twice daily and remove all ice, or provide a safe tank or bucket heater. Horses prefer to drink water that is slightly warm in the winter and their water consumption typically increases if water is kept de-iced either with an automatic de-icer or manually.

Continue providing free choice access to a trace mineral salt block through the winter, or supplementing your horse's feed with a small amount of salt, as these should both increase water consumption.

Attention to Detail

If you ride or work you horse in winter months, plan additional time for proper care both before and after rides.

Bits should be warmed prior to insertion in the horse's mouth. This can be accomplished in a variety of ways the most common include in a heated area (such as in a tack room or vehicle), in your hand, holding it under the arm, or inside a warm jacket. Wait until the bit is no longer cold to the touch before asking your horse to accept it.

Horses that sweat during winter rides need to be dried out completely before they are put away for the day. A thick winter coat can hold moisture for a long time and drying can be a time consuming task. Horses that are wet can be dried by rubbing with a towel, feeding hay, keeping the horse under cover, and applying a water-wicking cooler. Once the horse is dry remove the cooler and fluff up his hair before turn out, which will aid the insulating effectiveness of his coat.

You might consider trace- or body clipping horses that will be worked throughout the winter months to reduce the areas of thick winter hair that could trap moisture. This will not eliminate the need for returning your horse to dry but can reduce the time it takes to accomplish a dry horse. If clipping a horse's winter coat (which is his natural defense against winter weather) you must blanket accordingly.

Mud Management

There is likely not a farm in Kentucky that lacks mud during the winter. The key for you as a horse owner is to ensure that there is a place where your horse can find reprieve. It is common to develop mud around feeders, waterers, and gates, but your horse can generally escape the muddy areas for chunks of the day if there is adequate space for the number of animals in the field.

It is important to remove excess mud from your horse's legs on a regular basis to avoid fungal and bacterial infections. If an infection develops from excessive mud exposure your horse will need to be removed from the muddy environment and treated and cleaned regularly until the infection subsides.

You might consider creating a <u>sacrifice area</u> and <u>build-ing a pad</u> (using rocks able to withstand traffic and allow for drainage) where you feed and water your animals to help prevent mud and erosion. For more information on developing a properly designed feed pad contact your local extension agent.

Horses and other livestock can become mired in especially muddy areas. If there is such an area in your horse's field it might be best managed by fencing it off

from the rest of the pasture to keep your horses out. In the event that your horse becomes trapped in the mud and needs to be extricated dial 911 and emergency personal trained in large animal extrication will be contacted.

Ice Management

Ice chunks that build up in your horse's hooves will make him walk like he is on high heels, which is not good for his tendons and ligaments or for his muscles. Ice chunks need to be removed from your horse's hooves whenever they appear or at least twice daily. It is important to be extra attentive when picking your horse's hooves during the winter to remove ice chunks and check for lacerations caused by ice or other material.

Icy areas in and around barns and fields are problematic as they are usually slick and can cause accidents leading to injuries. Areas that are prone to developing ice should be closely monitored and might need to be sprinkled with sand, broken up (with a shovel or other tool), or fenced off to prevent slipping.

Water that becomes ice covered should also be monitored closely during winter weather. Best practice is to fence off wet areas and keep your horses out. Be sure to check the areas daily and be wary of horses that might venture onto the ice and fall through.

Shelter

Horses need shelter from the elements. Shelter comes in a variety of forms and the type you use largely depends on your facilities and finances. Trees and low places act as a natural wind barrier and can also provide some protection from precipitation. A three -sided constructed shelter provides the best protection from winter precipitation for pastured horses. It is important to ensure that your shelter offers adequate space for your animals and allows for their natural behavior and accommodates their hierarchy so that even the lowest horse in the pecking order can benefit from the shelter. In larger herds more than one shelter might be required.

Blankets

Many horse owners choose to blanket their horses during the winter months. A horse living outside that doesn't grow a thick winter coat could benefit from a blanket especially during cold snaps or inclement weather. Additionally horses that don't have access to manmade shelter will benefit from a proper turnout blanket during inclement weather.

A few tips for safe blanketing:

• Only apply blankets to clean, dry horses.

Use the appropriate blanket for the appropriate use. A stable blanket is for use in a stable and it is not waterproof. Therefore a horse should not wear a stable blanket when he is in the field or pasture. A turnout blanket is for use during turnout and is designed to be waterproof. Horses that live out in the elements wearing blankets should wear waterproof and

- breathable turnout rugs. A blanket that isn't waterproof will quickly become saturated make your horse cold, which is the opposite of the desired effect of blanket use.
- Use the blanket that is most appropriate for your horse's needs and the weather conditions. If it's 40 degrees your horse probably only needs a lightweight blanket. If it's -10 degrees he might prefer a heavy weight blanket.
- Remove or change blankets as weather appropriate. Sweating in a blanket on a hot day can be just as problematic as wearing a stable blanket in wet weather.
- Ensure the blanket properly fits your horse and that the straps and surcingles are appropriately fitted.
- Check horses wearing blankets at least twice daily. Check the shoulder area for rubs and sores caused by the blanket. Also check to ensure that the straps and surcingles are all safely and securely in place.
- Repair rips as soon as possible.
- Remove your horse's blanket and groom him on a regular basis.
- When removing the blanket for any length of time be sure to fluff up the horse's hair to allow it to work to properly insulate.

Take-Home Message

Feeding a diet rich in forage and providing protection from the mud and elements is a great way to ensure your horses' health and wellbeing during the winter months. For information specific to winter horse management in your area or region contact your local extension office or your veterinarian

The Case for ASHA Registration Page 7

"My horse is already registered with Shire Horse Society in England. Why should I register him or his offspring with ASHA as well?" Well, I am here to state my case and give you some prime reasons why ASHA registration is valuable for you and your horse.

- <u>Less cost for postage</u> You won't have overseas postage (unless you live overseas) when you work with ASHA. One Forever USPS stamp mails two registration applications or one certificate for transfer. There is also less chance of your paperwork getting lost in the Atlantic! We can also process your SHS transfer at the same time as your ASHA transfer, saving you more postage!
- Less time to process registrations and transfers With less transport time comes decreased time to process the paperwork. Our typical "smooth" transfer is less than two weeks, including mailing. If you don't need the certificate right away, we may hold the certificate to mail a number of them to the president for his signature to reduce postage costs for the association. Registrations can usually be completed within three weeks, sooner if necessary, depending on the required DNA lab work. Horses already registered with a foreign Shire registry can be processed in considerably less time if the DNA work has already been completed. We work cooperatively with the other Shire registries to share DNA profiles.
- <u>No Stallion Inspections</u> This has recently become a major headache for some breeders whose stallions passed initial inspections, and then failed later required inspections after siring foals. From the point after failure or lack of inspection, any new foals would not be eligible for SHS registration. By registering the stallion with ASHA, the stallion and his offspring have their "birth certificate" showing that they truly are purebred Shires regardless of SHS inspection results. No videos need to be produced, either.
- <u>Breed your mares to the stallion you want</u> If your chosen stallion is registered only with ASHA and your mare is only registered with SHS, the registry in England will not allow you to register that foal with SHS since they do not recognize our studbook thus far. We will register offspring of SHS horses, but not the other way around.
- Know that your Shire's recent pedigree has been parentage verified. All horses in our database foaled since 1989 and the parents of all those foaled since 1991 have DNA (or blood types) on file to compare. SHS will enter horses in their studbook "subject to parentage verification" and the follow-up is not always clear.
- <u>Less hassle to show in ASHA shows</u> Without ASHA registration, you must provide proof of ownership of your foreign-registered horse. This requires you to send a copy of the current registration papers showing you as owner. With ASHA registration, we look up the registration and ownership, and verify that with the show for you.

<u>Proof of registration is easily available</u> – If you need proof of registration, and your paperwork is processed but in "transport", we can email that proof to shows, sales, or other events.

Work with a happy voice in the ASHA office – If you have questions or concerns, I am always here to help, and I am in a closer time zone for more efficient correspondence! We also have a toll-free phone number for your convenience and considerably less cost to you!

With all these good reasons, why not register your horses with ASHA???

A Bit of Shire History:

Chandler Earl 'Feek' Tooke was born in Redfield, South Dakota on April 12th, 1909 in Redfield, South Dakota to Earl and Bessie Tooke. His parents moved Feek and his 5 brothers; Frank, Fay, Grandville (Red), Dick and Bill, to their homestead 13 miles west of Ekalaka, Montana in 1913.

Chandler's nickname, 'Feek', came from an aunt who didn't care for the name Chandler, so she called him Felix. Fay couldn't pronounce Felix, and instead said Feek.

The Tooke brothers were interested in rodeos, so they built an arena at the ranch and held their first rodeo, Memorial Day, 1931. Headed by Feek, the Tooke brothers branched out and produced rodeos in Ekalaka, Baker and Miles City Montana; Belle Fourche and Deadwood South Dakota; Dickinson, Hettinger, and Bowman North Dakota. They leased bucking horses to other rodeo producers, and Tooke Broncs bucked in arenas from Salt Lake City to Chicago and New York's Madison Square Garden.

Feek was a horseman; he broke horses to ride and work, bought sold and traded horses. To his way of thinking any work worth doing should be done with a horse, and he used horses other cowboys couldn't handle. His biggest vision was to breed horses to buck, providing a continous source of rodeo bronc for years to come in the rodeo arena, despite the general consensus from the public that it couldn't be done.

Pat O'Kane, a Powder River ranch foreman, developed a horse breed in the 1920s he thought would have the agility, size, and stamina to stand up to hard riding in the rugged badlands. He crossed a Shire stallion to Thoroughbred mares. The colts grew to be ideal for what Pat had in mind, but they all had a bucking horse's mentality and only a handful of cowboys were able to ride Pat's rough string.

Feek bought Pat's horses when Pat retired in 1936. No one had raised horses solely to buck in rodeos, but Pat's Shire-Thoroughbred cross was a bucking horse bloodline and Feek's ambition was to create top-of-theline broncs. There were thousands of bronc prospects available, but he could see a time in the future when the almost endless supply would dry up.

A Shire stallion and mares from east of Ekalaka were purchased from General Marion Sweeney in 1938. A significant building block in Feek's breeding venture was when he bought King Larrygo from Fox Chemical Company, an Iowa Shire farm in 1943. The dark sorrel was three years old and weighed a ton, and the blue ribbon winner in Show Class at the Iowa State Fair. King was shipped by rail to Baker, Montana where Feek would take possession of the horse and his vision was starting to take shape. Breeding the large sized King to rank mares would produce stock with size, quickness, and attitude, that you see in horses in today's arenas.

Feek's ambition to see a pasture filled with King's offspring was short lived when a cranky mare kicked the valuable stallion ruining him for stud services. Before this tragic end to a breeding career, King sired his only colt, the one that would be dubbed 'Rodeo's Bronc Patriarch'. Little did Feek know that this colt would change the face of broncs and the way contractors breed rodeo stock. This dark sorrel stood 17 hands and tipped the scales at 1,700 pounds would go by the name Prince. His mother was a Shire with a bad disposition, which Prince inherited. Several contractors claim their studs are the greatest bronc sires of all time, their claims are exaggerated. Prince is without question, the number one bucking horse stallion in rodeo history. From that moment on, the attitude and the 'Tooke' look would live within the arenas all over North America forever.

Feek bred Prince to selected hot tempered mares out of another Tooke stud called 'Snowflake'. Snowflake, an albino Arabian, was purchased by Feek in 1945. Snowflake was broke to ride, but he was a man-hater with a bad attitude, and his colts had the same disposition. Snowflake & Prince crosses produced bucking horse bloodlines unequaled in rodeo history. Prince was only bucked 10 times in his lifetime, and under today's scoring system, with 50 points being perfect for the horse, he was a consistent 46 point horse. With this he passed along his bucking ability to his offspring, which included three exceptional bronc stallions...mammoth-sized General Custer, award winning Timberline, and a roan stud that was sold to legendary cowboy Casey Tibbs. All three horses sired world champion bucking stock. Custer sired Major Reno (NFR Saddle Bronc of the Year in 1968 & 1969), Sheep Mountain (NFR Saddle Bronc of the Year in 1967), and Gray Wolf.

Feek has been described by many rodeo historians as 'the Henry Ford of the bucking horse industry", Feek Tooke proved to all skeptics that great bucking horses can be successfully bred and raised.

At the National Finals Rodeo in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on December 7th 1968, Feek's vision became reality that night. At the Jim Norick Arena at Oklahoma State Fair grounds when Chandler Earl Tooke would ride into the arena to receive the award presenting Sheep Mountain for the Top Saddle Bronc at the NFR, it would be the first bred to buck horse to win a major award. With famous Oklahoman, Clem McSpadden, presenting Feek with a plaque you can tell by the smile on Feek's face in photos at this moment that this was his crowning achievement in rodeo thus far. After this great moment Feek would ride out of the arena and suffered a fatal heart attack while clinching his most prized possession at the young age of 59. This would leave the family business and Tooke legacy to his son Ernest. Shortly after Feek's death Clem was quated as saying "Without Feek Tooke and his broncs, we wouldn't have bucking horses...he was years ahead of his time."

Bucking horse breeding has become a big business across the United State and Canada, and most breeders are using the proven Tooke bloodlines. These bloodlines have produced more than 6,000 bucking horse. Eighty percent of the bucking horses selected for the National Finals Rodeos are related, and most world champion broncs since 1987 shared the same genetics. Erv Korkow (PRCA HOF 2009) was an admirer of the Tooke horses and he would purchase five big mares in the early 70s that foaled with colts from Gray Wolf and Timberline to begin his breeding program. Calgary Stampede (HOF 2008) used General Custer's son Gray Wolf and he sired 33 colts in the mid 70s which would results in Grated Coconut, Bareback Horse of the Year 6x down the road. Harry Vold (11x Contractor of the Year and HOF 1994) would use Tooke's genetics produced the famous Bobby Joe Skoal, Saddle Bronc of the Year 3x. Bennie Beutler (Contractor of the Year 1997, and HOF 2010) used the Tooke genes to give the world Commotion, Bareback Horse of the year 3x. The Tooke legacy spread like wild fire through and it continued through other numerous well known PRCA contractor herds such as Leo Cremer (HOF 1979), James Sutton (HOF 1982), Cotton Rosser (Contractor of the Year 1985, HOF 1995), Reg Kesler (HOF 1992), Neal Gay (HOF 1993), Mike Cervi (HOF 2003), Marv Brookman (HOF 2005), Ike Sankey, Sonny Riley, Bradford Ivy, along with many others.



The Miles City Bucking Horse Sale is world famous, and the first bucking horse sale was Feek's idea. Bill Linderman was rodeo's top all-around cowboy and he expressed an interest in rodeo production during a conversation with Feek in June 1946. Feek brought up the idea of a horse bucking out of a chute and sold at auction, but he said he didn't have the time to put an auction together and suggested Bill give it a try. Bill Linderman promoted the "World's Premier Bucking Horse Auction" at Billings Montana in May of 1947, and Miles City Bucking Horse Sale was first held in 1950. Another one of Feek's ideas was putting the world's finest cowboys against the world's finest rough stock, creating the matched bronc riding in Ekalaka in July of 1948 in Ekalaka,

Montana. That was followed up in Dickinson, North Dakota in 1948. This pitted the top cowboys in the world against the top rodeo stock in the world. This was the first event of its kind held. It became an annual even at the Home on the Range Rodeo in Sentinel Butte, North Dakota.

Feek Tooke promoted a matched bronc riding in Ekalaka, on July 28 1948. A second matched ride was held in Dickinson, North Dakota, in September 1948. The matches were the first rodeo events of that kind held in the northwest and became an annual event at the Home on the Range in Sentinel Butte, North Dakota.

The ultimate reward for any man or woman who participated in rodeo is enshrinement in the National Cowboy Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma or the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Honorees in the National Cowboy Hall of Fame and Western Heritage Center was organized in 1955, have been selected from rodeo's beginning years in the 1890s to the present. A large number were born before 1900. The PRCA Hall of Fame was established in 1979 as the Pro Rodeo Hall of Champions. The name was later changed to Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame and added notable rodeo participants who contributed to rodeo's growth, but were not world champions. The majority of honorees in the Pro Rodeo Hall had arena careers in the 1930s and 40s, to the later generation of PRCA members.

Several men and women have been elected into both Halls, but an honoree's selection into both in the same year is quite rare. Prior to 2008, only three people made both in one year: Andy Jauregui in 1979, CR Boucher in 2001 and June Ivory in 2004. Feek Tooke from Ekalaka, Montana became the fourth when he was inducted to both prestigious Hall of Fames July 2008. The awards were presented to Tooke family members.

A question to ask is what if Prince would have never lived? The Tooke genetics started with Prince. Tooke bloodlines are easily identified as being big boned, large framed, feathered legs, more than usual mane; add a long roman nose and you will see Prince's ancestry. Without Prince's gene's and Feek's idea, who knows where the rodeo horse breeding programs would be today.

The foresight of Feek Tooke has had a huge impact on the world of rodeo for 70+ years that continues through today. None of this would have without his vision and a colt named Prince. Without Prince, Feek would not be remembered as a rodeo pioneer, and without Feek, Prince never would have existed, vastly changing history. Feek has been recognized for his contributions to the world of rodeo and his family is now trying to get some of his horses into the hall of fame. Both Feek's and Prince's legacies will live on every time a cowboy settles into the chute and nods his head, you will forever remember where it all started.

Information for this has been compiled by four generations of Tooke's...Thelma (Feek's 96 year old widow), Ernest (Feek's sons), Tim (Ernest's only son), and Toby (Tim's son). The Tooke ranch is still home to this day with 50-60 horses still roaming the land in Carter county and all of them are direct decedents of Prince.

- To foster and preserve the traditions pertaining to the Shire horse;
- To encourage original investigations in determination and development of the best types of horses and the breeding to only purebred sires;

- To assist in procuring and making available for breeding suitable stallions and mares;
 To collect, revise, preserve and publish the history and pedigrees of purebred horses, particularly Shire stallions and mares, under such regulations as may be prescribed by said organization;
 To do all and every other act or thing necessary, suitable and/or proper for the accomplishment of all or any of the purposes or in the furtherance of any of the powers herein set forth and to do every other act or thing incidental to any of the powers. to or appurtenant to or connected with said powers.

Genetic Variability in the American Shire Horse (Summarized from full final report)

Introduction

The Shire is known as the largest of all horse breeds, standing up to 2 m (19.2 hands) tall at the shoulder. Originating in England, the breed descends from 'The Great Horse', a heavy horse developed for medieval warfare. Later bred as a general -purpose agricultural and urban draught horse, the average Shire horse weighs about 910 kg and can pull a 4,500 kg load.

Shire horses played a key role in early American history. In the early nineteenth century, 80% of Americans lived on farms. Draft horses were in high demand, replacing oxen in terms of agricultural efficiency and general draught power. To satisfy demand for quality heavy horses, agents were sent to France, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom to purchase pedigreed stock. Shire horses were first introduced to the United States in the mid-1800's, and the American Shire Horse Association (ASHA) was established in 1885 to oversee registration of animals, genetic preservation, and breed promotion. The registry has been active continuously except for the period between 1955 and 1961, when most breeding activity ceased and the Shire horse nearly became extinct in the United States. Although some Shires are still used as agricultural or urban work horses, or in promotional hitches for breweries and other commercial businesses, the widespread mechanization of the early twentieth century and subsequent urbanization of rural farmland has resulted in a worldwide drop in Shire numbers and a shift to more recreational uses for the breed. Today, the American Livestock Breeds Conservancy has assigned the American Shire horse 'critical' status, its most serious threat category reserved for populations with less than 200 new registrations annually in the United States, and an estimated global population of less than 2,000 animals.

Despite concern for the breed's future in the United States, however, no assessment of population history or genetic variability has been completed to date. Such data are critical to allow for determination of breed conservation strategies nd, metrics of success once genetic management programs are implemented. Therefore, the objective of this study was to evaluate current and historic levels and inbreeding, population demographics, and the number and contributions of ancestors and founders to the American Shire horse population.

Together, the top ten stallions accounted for nearly half (48.5%) of the male influence on modern day pedigrees, while the top ten mares accounted for only an 11.6% contribution. Investigation of paternal lineages revealed only six sire lines present in the current generation, with 96% of horses tracing to just three foundation sires.

Within the American population of Shire horses, only six sirelines are present in the current generation. Of these lines, three foundation stallions account for 95.6% of the modern day paternal lineages. Champion's Clansman (ca. 1900) represents the highest contribution at 51%, while Ponton Buoyant (1939) and Crimwell Mimic (1936) contribute 32.2% and 12.5%, respectively.

Study Conclusions

Current measures of genetic variability for the American Shire horse indicate that although the breed is not in immediate danger, conservation strategies should be developed and implemented to prevent further loss of genetic diversity. Small effective population size, unequal contributions of founders, low effective numbers of founders and ancestors, and a high ratio of the two parameters provides evidence that the breed has undergone loss of genetic variability over time beyond that expected from random genetic drift. Additionally, an increase in the number of foals born annually and subsequent reduction in use of imported breeding stock has fueled a linear rise in inbreeding coefficients in recent years. Thus, while current levels of inbreeding are not particularly high compared to several other closed breed populations, there is valid concern for reduction of genetic variability in future generations. The registry may wish to consider prohibiting mating of close relatives or incentives for breeders who utilize breeding stock from less popular strains. Additionally, steps may be taken to help educate breeders in methods that will minimize inbreeding and help maintain a broad genetic base for the breed. Careful and deliberate intervention, along with vigilant evaluation of conservation strategies, will allow the American Shire horse to maintain a genetically vibrant population.
